The Finger Lakes Concert Band performance at Honeoye High school on Thursday, October 19, at 7:30 PM. was outstanding. This was a combined concert with the Honeoye High School Concert Band, under the direction of Grace Wood, and included the overture to Rossini's The Barber of Seville; Leroy Anderson's Sandpaper Ballet; J.S. Jig, an entertaining piece inspired by J.S. Bach and Irish jigs; and Vaughan Williams' Folk Song Suite. The combined works with the Honeoye band included Fillmore's march Americans We and the tone poem The Witch and the Saint by Steven Reineke. The special Strauss French horn concerto featuring Honeoye senior, Trevor Healy, was truly well done and the audience reacted with a standing ovation.

This past Tuesday, October 17, I had the pleasure of going to the Livingston County Chamber of Commerce Coffee Connection starting at 8:30 in the morning in Geneseo. Like the other times I had attended, the room was filled with people excitedly bringing to life their short stories about their businesses. Our 2 p.m. Sunday Springwater Trails get together this past Sunday, October 22, planned by Gene and Georgia Binder, was attended by 3 bicyclists and 12 hikers. Five people and 1 dog enjoyed a leisurely 2 mile walk picking up and identifying leaves, seeds, and sticks of deciduous trees and plants while the remaining four people hiked the farthest. Come join us on the hike Sunday 29th October that will follow a section of the main path of the Finger Lakes Trail in Urbana, just south of Hammondsport. It's a short easy hike, just 2.6 miles, and it follows the rim of a deep gully cut by the Mitchellsville Creek. This section slopes gently downhill from north to south with just a few short steep sections. The northern two thirds passes through a dense hemlock wood, and the path is a soft bed of hemlock needles, and

there of views of the deep gully along the way. There are two 'beauty spots' along the route; about a third of the way from the top there's a short side-track that juts out over the gorge, giving good views from a height, and about two thirds of the way down there is a picnic clearing by the creek. Details for our hikes are on the springwatertrails.org website by the middle of the week if not before, or ask a regular hiker. We are having new people join us as a result of the announcements in the Lake Country Weekender and in the Pennysavers written by Dena. Those who like to hike are also encouraged to lead one of our hikes so as to present variety in the places we explore.
