Melissa planned our Sunday hike in the Houghton Land Preserve in Corning, a part of the Finger Lakes Land Trust. This was our first excursion to this nature preserve. We had 13 hikers, 3 of which enjoyed two miles of the trails. The other 10 traveled all the trails which were very well marked and maintained. They saw a bear, while the 3 of us saw emerald green moss, a large

green caterpillar, several types of trees and mushrooms, beech, maple, oak, ironwood, and Eastern white pine. At the bench, we could see the tops of at least four ridges . . . a treat because the Naturalists are usually relegated to the lower flatter regions of each hike. Melissa works on
