fir, Nordmann fir, Grand fir, Korean fir, Canaan fir, and Douglas-fir may be available. Stephen Scheiderich will be driving the Case 4 x 4 utility vehicle to the plantations. Customers are requested to call ahead for a reservation similar to how a restaurant takes reservations. The farm owners appreciate this way of helping to keep everyone safe – the customers and the staff! Thank you to everyone that has called ahead to help keep from having more than 10 cars in the parking lot at one time.
