Van Hooreweghe, Director, Collaborative Action 646-522-0583 mobile / www.climategfl.org that you might like to know about. "What changes can be made in agriculture that may have mitigating effects on climate change? One of the best measures is to improve overall soil health - as good soil health helps to improve plant productivity and yield (hence reduced need for

fertilizers) and also helps to sequester carbon. The NY State Soil Health Roadmap provides a lot of good information on building soil health and its economic and environmental value. There are also other on-site measures, such as feeding livestock from pasture instead of grains (corn and soy) that help reduce methane emissions and adopting more energy efficient technologies to operate farm equipment and buildings. We are putting together a climate change and agriculture in the Genesee-Finger Lakes Region fact sheet that isn't finished yet. Check our website. In the meantime, Cornell Cooperative Extension's Climate Smart Farming is a helpful resource."
